Jason Jennings, a 37 –year old resident of Montgomery County, today announced his intention to run for Maryland’s 4th Congressional seat in the United States Congress. In announcing his candidacy, Jennings, who was raised in Prince George’s County, said: “I am entering the race because I can no longer settle for the lesser of evils choices in my congressional representation.
